- Midday service improved on Route 542, running every 20 minutes
- Route 542 would provide service to the South Kirkland Park-and-Ride
- Route 542 would run later in the evening

- · Improved midday and evening service
- Reduced wait times, as buses would run more often during rush hours and midday
- New intra-Eastside connections between South Kirkland, Overlake, and Redmond
- Eastside connections to/from the Denny Triangle and Capitol Hill neighborhoods maintained
- Service to Green Lake maintained via Route 541
