


Ride a bus between Eastside and Seattle on SR-520?

Metro and Sound Transit are looking for feedback on how to improve future transit service on SR-520, including improved connections to Link light rail. Outreach is being conducted for Metro routes 252, 255, 257, 268, 277, 311, and Sound Transit routes ST 540, ST 541, ST 542, and ST 545. Improvements are needed because trips between the Eastside and Seattle are expected to become slower and less reliable due to rapid growth and major developments throughout the region.





The input gathered during Phase II will help develop a single service-change proposal to be released to the public this fall.

If you ride the bus across the SR-520 bridge, we want to hear from you.

The public and stakeholder feedback received in Phase I was used to develop various service concepts that fall into three themes:

Option A **No Change**

No change to service.

(Route 255 is redirected to surface streets)

Subject to future traffic

Option B

Frequency Focus

Most routes re-directed to UW light rail station for busrail transfers; more frequent bus service with expanded service times; new service to South Lake Union, Children's Hospital and S. Kirkland.

Option C

Connections Focus

Some routes re-directed to UW light rail station for bus-rail transfers; better connections serving new markets; slightly more frequent service with slightly expanded service times.

During Phase I of the outreach process conducted earlier this year, we asked customers about their current transit experience on SR-520, what they thought about re-directing routes to the University of Washington Link station for bus-rail transfers, and potential service and new connections to South Lake Union.

During this process we:

- Distributed more than 4,000 informational cards, reaching customers on buses, at transit centers, and at bus stops.
- Heard from over 2,000 customers through our online survey and community conversation discussions.

A majority of survey respondents said they'd consider bus-rail transfer at the University of Washington light rail station, if:

- it didn't increase their travel time more than 5 minutes.
- transfer environment was improved.

Survey respondents also said transit resources should be reinvested to:

- increase service frequency.
- reduce crowding.
- provide greater reliability.
- expand service earlier and later on weeknights and weekends.
