Dear Senator Murray:

As leaders in the Puget Sound region, we are joining citizens and communities from around the country today to "Stand Up for Transportation." We call on you and your colleagues to take action to increase funding and reauthorize the nation's surface transportation programs, Moving Ahead for Progress in the 21st Century (MAP-21), before May 31, 2015 when the current extension expires.

Transportation is the foundation of our national and regional economy. The transportation system in the Puget Sound region has benefitted greatly from many federal programs, as we have leveraged local investments with critical federal dollars to stretch precious public resources. We appreciate your past support of these important partnerships, and urge you now to reauthorize MAP-21. Congestion on our highways is continuing to increase, with highway delays costing our region over \$800 million in 2013. By 2040, the population in our service territory will increase by more than one million people, or 30 percent.

To keep the economic engine of this region vibrant and productive, it is critical that transportation infrastructure improvements keep pace with our growth.

As members of the Sound Transit Board, we are building a regional high capacity multi-modal transit system to provide mobility options to commuters who are now wasting productivity and valuable time while stuck in traffic. In 2014, Sound Transit set all-time records for boardings on the regional system, resulting in less congestion and more choice for commuters. In fact, Sound Transit's rate of ridership growth was more than four times that of transit ridership growth nationally with 32 million boardings across the regional light rail, commuter rail and express bus system. We are leveraging and integrating all the transportation services and infrastructure across the region, but unless we can continue to expand our system to reach new residents and businesses, we will lose the mobility improvements we have achieved to date. The continued build-out of the regional transit system is not possible without a continued robust federal partnership and the reauthorization of MAP-21.

We urge you to support legislation to address the funding crisis facing the Highway Trust Fund and to join us in "Standing Up for Transportation."
