

Boeing Access Road Station Project

Summer 2025

About the project

Sound Transit's Boeing Access Road Station Project would add a new station to the existing 1 Line of the Link light rail network along the west side East Marginal Way South, just north of South 112th Street in Tukwila. The station was part of the 1996 Sound Move Plan and the voter-approved Sound Transit 3 (ST3) system plan in 2016 to enhance connectivity and accessibility in our region.

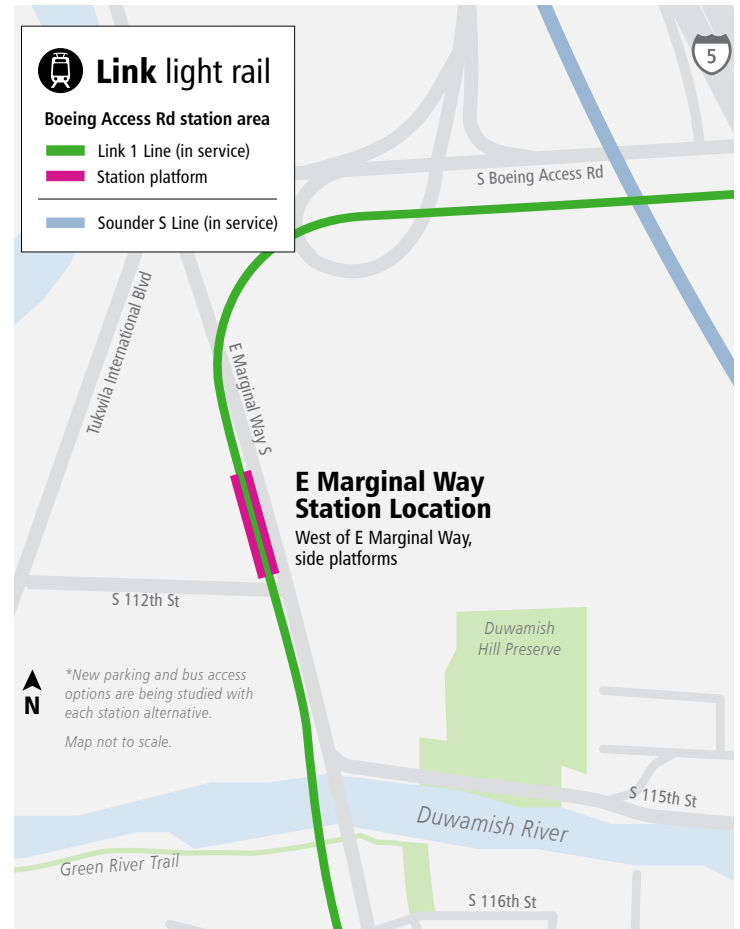
Project benefits and elements

Adding a new station at Boeing Access Road would:

- **Bridge the 5.5-mile gap between the Rainier Beach and Tukwila International Boulevard stations**, expanding access to high-capacity transit in the region.
- **Increase access to the larger Link light rail network** to help people get to the places they need to go daily.
- **Provide connections to Link light rail** by including a new parking facility and a bus transfer facility.
- **Accommodate future growth** and planned transportation improvements in the project area.

Equity and inclusion

We are challenging ourselves to plan, build, and operate public transit that provides equitable access to housing, education, medical facilities, and job opportunities, especially for those most harmed by institutional and systemic racism.

Spring 2025 Update

In March 2025, the Sound Transit Board of Directors identified the East Marginal Way location as the proposed location of the South Boeing Access Road Infill Station for environmental review.

Community engagement

The project is currently in the conceptual engineering and environmental review phase of planning. In this phase, we develop conceptual designs and evaluate the project's potential environmental effects. Environmental analyses will comply with the National Environmental Policy Act (NEPA) and the State Environmental Policy Act (SEPA).

Along with technical considerations, community feedback will inform the station design and associated elements. We are coordinating with the City of Tukwila, community organizations, and individuals to host briefings, open houses, and additional outreach and engagement.

Community engagement and input help Sound Transit plan and design a system that reflects your community's needs and desires. There will be several opportunities to engage throughout the project, and you can reach out with questions, thoughts, or a request for a briefing for your community.
