

#### Annual Employment Change, 2010-2018



**51,000 wage & salary jobs** added to region last year (2.5% increase)

**381,000 jobs** added to region since 2010 (22% increase)


King and Snohomish counties have accounted for **85%** of job growth since 2010

Unemployment has dropped to 3.8%

#### Annual Population Change in the Central Puget Sound 2010-2018




Regional population of 4.1 million


**68,000 increase** in last year, **444,000** increase since 2010


- In 2017, 6<sup>th</sup> highest transit boardings per capita in nation

### A crisis in affordability




Roughly 60% increase in home prices and apartment rents in past 5 years

### Who will be living here?



In 2050, the region's residents will be:

#### Older



18% of the region's population will be over the age of 65 by 2050, up from 14% today.

#### More diverse



Between 2000 and 2016, 81% of the region's population growth was people of color.

#### In smaller households



In 2050 there will be 2.36 people per household on average, down from 2.50 today.



- 30% of jobs (500,000)


#### 9 Manufacturing Industrial Centers

- 4% of region's land area (41 mi²)
- 0.3% of population (11,000)
- 9.5% of jobs (160,000)

- Centers and station areas






