

# Bellevue Rider Services Building

The Bellevue Rider Services Building is adjacent to the Bellevue Transit Center in downtown Bellevue. Rider amenities include rider information and transit schedules, public phones, community information, bike racks and public restrooms. Sidewalk improvements adjacent to the Bellevue Transit Center were also completed in 2002 as part of this project.

Additional amenities of the transit center include a City of Bellevue Police Station located in the Rider Services Building, and public art.

On the northeast corner of the transit center, an internally lit sculpture by Barbara Grygutis titled "Windswept," evokes an ancient, weathered tree.
