

Overlake Transit Center/NE 40th

The Overlake Transit Facility is a local and regional transit hub, providing a park-and-ride lot and a convenient transfer site for riders using buses operated by Sound Transit and Metro and for private shuttle services operated by employers in the Overlake area.

The site includes the Microsoft Shuttle Operations Building as well as the Rider Services Building and houses customer information, a bike station, the Greater Redmond Transportation Management Association, a Redmond police outpost, a concessionaire and driver restrooms.
