

Totem Lake Freeway Station/NE 128th

The Totem Lake Freeway Station project created a new I-405 overpass connecting NE 128th Street, and provides direct access to/from the north and southbound HOV lanes on I-405. The station serves the Totem Lake area of Kirkland including the Kingsgate Park-and-Ride and the Totem Lake Transit Center.

East/west mobility across I-405 was improved as well as fast, reliable connections to ST Express and King County Metro Transit buses. The project also includes public art, new landscaping and a covered pedestrian walkway connecting the park-and-ride with the new freeway transit station located on the direct-access ramps.
