

- 52+ media articles or posts
- 6 Stakeholder Roundtable discussions
- Outreach to 22+ social service providers that represent low-income, underserved, minority and non-English speaking populations



FUNDING: A PARTNERSHIP APPROACH TACOMA LINK EXPANSION



Sound Transit 2, adopted by voters in 2008, includes funding for a partnership to expand Tacoma Link. In addition to the Sound Transit 2 capital contribution, Sound Transit is seeking funding through a federal "Small Starts" grant and



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For each corridor considered, we asked these questions." Would this corridor:

- Improve connections to regional transit? Increase transit ridership and reduce
- car use?
- Connect to an existing neighborhood or major activity center?
- Improve transit service between downtown Tacoma and at least one neighborhood?
- Serve existing or proposed areas of high-density housing or jobs?

*In order to move forward, a corridor had to receive a yes to all questions.

SCREENING CRITERIA TACOMA LINK EXPANSION

- Serve an area that:
 - is home to many low-income and/or minority residents, or
 - has received relatively low infrastructure investments?
- Connect to an existing mixed-use center or a designated manufacturing/industrial center?
- challenges?



Avoid major costly engineering

- Improve mobility and transportation access for residents and visitors.
- Increase transit ridership.
- Serve underserved neighborhoods and communities.
- Use transit to spur economic development and other types of investment.
- Ensure that the project is environmentally sensitive and sustainable.

Establish a project that is competitive for federal funding.


