

DETERMINATION OF NONSIGNIFICANCE (DNS) SOUTH TACOMA STATION ACCESS IMPROVEMENTS PROJECT

Description of Proposal: Sound Transit proposes to provide access improvements to the South Tacoma Station along the Sounder South Commuter Rail line. Access to the South Tacoma Station and the surrounding area would include improved walking, bicycling, parking, and bus facilities. Other proposed improvements include new and updated sidewalks, Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA) compliant ramps, and bike lanes.

Proponent: Sound Transit (Central Puget Sound Regional Transit Authority)

Location of the Proposal: Tacoma, Washington

Lead Agency: Sound Transit (Central Puget Sound Regional Transit Authority)

The lead agency for this proposal has determined that it does not have a probable significant adverse impact on the environment. An environmental impact statement (EIS) is not required under RCW 43.21C.030(2)(c). This decision was made after review of the completed environmental checklist and technical reports.

This Determination of Nonsignificance (DNS) is issued under WAC 197-11-340 (2) and Sound Transit's SEPA rules (Resolution R2018-17). The lead agency will not act on the proposal until February 28, 2024, which is 14 days from the date of issue below.
