Subject: Modification to Shoreline South/145<sup>th</sup> Station Name

Dear Chair Keel and Members of the Sound Transit Board:

I am excited that Lynnwood Link is under construction with two stations scheduled to open in the City of Shoreline in 2024: Shoreline North/185<sup>th</sup> Station, and Shoreline South/145<sup>th</sup> Station. I write to request a minor modification to the permanent station name of the Shoreline South Station and that this be brought to a future Board meeting for consideration. I propose the current station known as the Shoreline South/145<sup>th</sup> Station to be renamed to

## "Shoreline South/148th Station".

In 2017 the Sound Transit Board adopted permanent station names for Lynnwood Link stations. During the adoption of the Shoreline South/145<sup>th</sup> Street station name in 2017, the station location was in the process of being moved three blocks due north in order to resolve significant traffic circulation issues and provide a more effective bus-rail integration. This change of location also ensured the onramp at 145<sup>th</sup> did not have to be relocated. These reasons led to placing the location of the station at NE 148<sup>th</sup> St. and not at 145<sup>th</sup> St. as originally planned. However, the station name was not changed concurrently with this shift of the station location 3 blocks north from 145<sup>th</sup> to 148<sup>th</sup>.

The city of Shoreline brought this request to my attention earlier this year noting that renaming this station Shoreline South/148<sup>th</sup> Street Station will accurately reflect the station's boarding location as well as align with the city's pedestrian bridge that will connect with the station on NE 148<sup>th</sup>St. Changing the name to Shoreline South/148<sup>th</sup> Station will provide clearer direction to riders by its true physical location. I believe this proposal stays true to the original rationale with only a technical change addressing the accuracy of the physical location.
