Proposed action

Authorizes the chief executive officer to execute a four-year contract, with two additional one-year options to extend, with WSP USA, Inc. to provide on-call general engineering consultant services for the Downtown Seattle Transit Tunnel Capital Improvements project for a total authorized contract amount not to exceed \$10,000,000.

Key features summary

- The DSTT Capital Improvements project involves work relating to Sound Transit's acquisition of the Downtown Seattle Transit Tunnel (DSTT); specifically, updating systems and preparing for the anticipated increase in demand from expanded light rail operations.
- Condition assessments conducted by King County Metro and Sound Transit have identified several areas for improvement which include safety and security updates, lighting improvements, utility updates, elevator/escalator repair, deep cleaning, and art restoration.
- The GEC will provide engineering/final design for these improvements through a series of individually negotiated Task Orders before, during, and after the planned DSTT transfer. The construction phase of these projects will be executed through separate contracts and funding.
- The major task orders under this contract are:
 - Task Order 1: The scope will include program management, project prioritization, and reporting for the portfolio of DSTT projects. This task order will last the life of the contract.
 - Task Order 2: The scope will cover structural scanning (LIDAR), and base mapping of the DSTT facility to provide a resource for future work.
 - Remaining Task Orders will be executed in order of project priority, based upon the results of Task Order 1.

Background

The ownership of the DSTT will be transferred in 2020 from King County Metro (KCM) to Sound Transit. As part of the process, KCM and Sound Transit have undertaken condition assessments of the DSTT. Based on these assessments, Sound Transit has identified a number of updates (the State of Good Repair projects) to prepare for the increase in ridership that will be experienced with system expansion.

Within this on-call contract, WSP will be providing management support for the DSTT program and engineering/final design for the individual DSTT projects. Work under this general engineering consultant services contract may include:

- Program/Project management and reporting;
- Preparation and implementation of project management plans;
- Engineering services in the preparation of technical assessments, studies and reports;
- Preparation of plans, specifications, and estimates;
- Permitting;
- Preparation of construction contract documents;
- Project schedule and budget development and management;
- Project reporting;
- Construction contract administration;
- Construction inspection;
- Testing and special inspection;
- Other specialty technical services related associated with the retrofit of the tunnel, stations, and ancillary facilities; and,
- Coordination of project work with other ST contract work and on-going rail operations

Procurement information

A Request for Qualifications (RFQ) for the Downtown Seattle Transit Tunnel (DSTT) General Engineering Consulting services, was advertised in June 2019. Sound Transit received one Statement of Qualifications (SOQ) from WSP USA. Inc. Procurement and Contracts determined that the solicitation was not restrictive and that there was adequate competition.

Based on the evaluation of the SOQ, the one submitter, WSP USA, Inc., was invited to interview. WSP USA, Inc. was determined to meet qualifications, therefore, invited to enter into negotiation for the DSTT Contract.

Fiscal information

This on-call contract would be used for the DSTT Capital Improvements project. The services described in this proposed action will be assigned on an as-needed basis after available budget is verified. Since the proposed services will be assigned on an as-needed basis, the distribution of cost will be determined as task orders are executed.

Disadvantaged and small business participation
