### **Proposed action**

Authorizes the chief executive officer to execute a Development Agreement with the City of SeaTac for the Federal Way Link Extension.

### **Key features summary**

- The City of SeaTac (City) and Sound Transit are entering into a Development Agreement to provide certainty and predictability to the Federal Way Link Extension as follows.
  - Confirming the policy framework by interpreting and vesting applicable codes and standards, as well as granting code departures;
  - Confirming key design elements, including required local roadway improvements and restoration of haul routes; and
  - Streamlining permitting, including the City's grant of land use approval through the Development Agreement and clarification of which project elements the City will be involved in reviewing and permitting.
- To satisfy the City's code required street improvement on S. 208<sup>th</sup> Street, Sound Transit will provide a fee-in-lieu payment of \$280,596.
- The agreement is part of the Design-Build Request for Proposals and will help guide and inform contractor proposals.
- This action was approved by the SeaTac City Council on January 22, 2019.

# **Background**

The Federal Way Link Extension adds approximately 7.8 miles of light rail from the Angle Lake light rail station at South 200th Street in the City of SeaTac to the City Center area in Federal Way. The extension generally parallels State Route 99 and Interstate 5, with stations at Kent/Des Moines, South 272nd/Star Lake Park-and-Ride, and the Federal Way Transit Center. New parking structures will be constructed at each of the three stations.

The Federal Way Link Final Environmental Impact Statement was issued on November 18, 2016 pursuant to the State Environmental Policy Act (SEPA) and National Environmental Policy Act (NEPA) and completing the SEPA process. The Sound Transit Board selected the project route, profile, and stations on January 26, 2017. The Federal Transit Administration issued a Record of Decision on March

6, 2017 and the Federal Highway Administration issued a Record of Decision on March 9, 2017, completing the NEPA process.

On January 26, 2017, the Sound Transit Board defined and selected the Federal Way Link Extension alignment, profile, stations, and associated infrastructure to be built between Angle Lake Station at S. 200th Street and the Federal Way Transit Center in Resolution No. R2017-02.

### **Fiscal information**

This action is within the baseline budget and sufficient monies remain after approval of this action to fund the remaining work in the construction services phase as contained in the current cost estimates.

The baseline budget for the Federal Way Link Extension project is \$2,451,535,000. Within the construction services phase, \$2,720,000 has been allocated to the budget line item for City of SeaTac. The proposed action would commit an additional \$280,596 to this line item and leave a remaining budget balance of \$2,236,988.
