Contract Modification with Mass Electric Construction Company for the East Link Extensions Systems Construction Contract

Proposed action

Authorizes the chief executive officer to increase the contract contingency with Mass Electric Construction Company for the East Link Systems Construction contract in the amount of \$15,000,000, for a new total authorized contract amount not to exceed \$395,450,000, with \$283,556,534 allocated to the East Link Extension, all within the Board approved project budget.

Key features summary

- In April 2017, the Board authorized a Heavy Civil GC/CM construction contract with Mass Electric Construction (MEC) for systems construction of the Northgate Link and East Link extensions. There is a single contract with MEC with costs tracked separately between the extensions.
- This request funds the East Link Starter Line changes and the added ST work described below, as well as replenishes the construction contingency to address future unanticipated changes.
- Delays in completing the predecessor civil contracts resulted in added costs and durations to the E750 MEC contract through December 2021 that were not anticipated in the baseline budget.
- Sound Transit desires to add work to the MEC's contract, estimated at approximately \$6 million.
 These changes include:
 - Pedestrian at-grade crossing equipment changes (additional flashers and gates),
 - East Link Starter Line changes: signal, communication, and software changes to convert South Bellevue Station to a terminus and switch heaters at Surrey Downs crossover,
 - o Other changes: emergency response matrix and code required radio architecture, and
 - Bellevue Downtown Tunnel cross-passage first responder access door.
- An additional \$1 million is needed for interface issues related to the civil work, including the I-90
 Floating Bridge pontoon transformer replacement, Kirkland wye west signal house power, and
 building management system commissioning interface.
 - This request does not address time-related overhead (TRO) and inefficiency costs MEC may have incurred resulting from civil contractor delays after December 2021. Sound Transit is negotiating with MEC to address any additional TRO and inefficiency cost. The additional cost will be addressed in a future ST Board Action, if necessary.

It is important to note that to the extent that the extended durations and additional costs such as
those referenced here are the result of the action or inactions of our East Link contractors,
designers and or construction management consultants, reimbursement of the costs will be
aggressively pursued by Sound Transit.


Background

East Link extends light rail 14 miles, with 10 stations from Seattle's International District to Judkins Park, across I-90 to Mercer Island and South Bellevue, through downtown Bellevue and the Bel-Red area to Redmond Technology Station. The original revenue service date was June 2023.

In February 2013, Sound Transit made the decision to combine the Systems construction contract for the Northgate Link and East Link extensions into one construction package based on a value engineering recommendation. The systems construction contract package includes installation of signals, traction electrification, traction power substations, overhead catenary systems (OCS), communications, and SCADA (supervisory control and data acquisition) systems across the Northgate and East Link extensions, covering 18 miles of the light rail system.

Throughout the civil delays, MEC has been able to progress the work through coordination with the civil contractors. This allowed MEC to be ready to complete the remaining work at the earliest possible opportunity and reduced the risk of demobilizing/remobilizing MEC and its specialized subcontractors.

Procurement information

This contract was procured on June 2, 2015, through the GC/CM procurement method. Request for Qualifications (RFQ) were due on July 11, 2015. Sound Transit received four (4) RFQ. The evaluation team shortlisted on September 14, 2015, two (2) most qualified submitters.

The Request for Final Proposal (RFFP) issued to the two (2) finalists. The RFFP was on October 21, 2015. The evaluation team selection MASS Electric as the highest qualified company.

This modification is within the original scope of work executed in the contract.

Fiscal information

This action is within the baseline budget and sufficient monies remain after approval of this action to fund the remaining work. This action does not impact the affordability of any other system expansion project.

The baseline budget for the East Link project is \$3,677,150,000. Within the construction phase, \$287,200,000 has been allocated to E750 East Link Systems. The action would commit an additional \$15,000,000 to this line item and leave a budget balance of \$7,444,133.
