

Procurement, Contracts and Agreements Division



Board Resolution No. R2018-40 requires the CEO to provide an annual report to the Board summarizing the performance of the agency's procurement and contracts program including accomplishments, challenges, and opportunities. This report was prepared by the Procurement, Contracts and Agreements Division (PCA).

ACCOMPLISHMENTS & HIGHLIGHTS

Awarded and Active Contracts and Agreements

PCA managed the agency's award of 534 contracts during 2022 with a total value of \$137M. The number of open, active contracts as of December 31, 2022 was 1,037 equaling \$11B. PCA supported the agency's execution of 61 agency agreements during 2022 with a total value of \$467M. The number of open, active agreements as of December 31, 2022 was 297 equaling \$3B.

Responsible Contractor

To strengthen the agency's administration of contractor responsibility and the significance of past performance in the procurement selection process, PCA worked closely with agency leadership in 2022 for the issuance of Agency Policy 301, Responsible Contractor, which affirmatively identifies the agency's criteria for contractor responsibility and consideration of past performance, including commitment to workers, prior to contract award.

Contracted Workforce

To strengthen the agency's management of the contracted workforce, consisting of all contractors, consultants and vendors, PCA worked closely with agency leadership in 2022 for the issuance of Agency Policy 302, Contracted Workforce. The policy created a central management structure for tracking the contracted workforce, for training and for monitoring their use of agency resources. Implementation of the Contractor Vaccination Mandate, for example, was included during 2022.

Contracting Expo

With PCA leadership, Sound Transit hosted a virtual Contracting Expo on October 27, 2022 entitled "Building Diverse Partnerships" for the architectural and engineering professional services community and construction industry in support of the agency's system expansion and non-system expansion projects. The event was live streamed with over 400 registered attendees local and national.

Agency Agreements

Developed and implemented the agency's Commitment Tracking Tool to manage and track the performance of agency obligations under Intergovernmental Agreements.

GC/CM Recertification

The agency's application to the State's Project Review Committee (PRC) was successful for a three-year recertification of the agency's authority to utilize the General Contractor/Construction Manager (GC/CM) alternative procurement and delivery method for public work.

Security Services

PCA worked throughout the year with Safety to provide supplemental security guard service contracts and to procure a new generation of security guard service contracts including the "commitment to workers" features of the agency's new Responsible Contractor policy.

Strategic Partner

PCA engaged continuously with the departments in strategic, forward-looking consultations for timely, effective procurements and agreements in support of the agency's projects, initiatives and business needs.
