#### Passenger Impact Portfolio Plan

#### **PROGRAM GOALS**

- Coordinate and schedule projects to minimize service impacts
- Integrate this activity as a regular business function

#### **METHODOLOGY**

- Passengers are our customers
- Preservation of planned service and urgency to return to full planned service
- Minimal disruption to passengers and passenger flow
- Project delivery efficiency (shared disruptions and mobilizations)



# Electromagnetic Cable Hanger Improvements Work planned for Weekends of 6/9 & 6/16

Project to improve design of hangers on the Floating Slabs in the tunnels.

- Why this is necessary: A safe, temporary solution is in place. This project will complete the permanent repairs.
- Passenger benefit: Ensure long term safety and reliability.
- What is the fix: New design of plates.
- What is the expected service impact: Nighttime single tracking (9pm to 9am) for both Friday and Saturday nights on two consecutive weekends. Normal service during the day.



# Routine Rail Replacement Program Work planned for every Tuesday night (5/30 – 7/25)

Replace sections of rail as a preventative maintenance

- Why this is necessary: These replacements are a necessary part of the overall state of good repair, which will aid in the continued useful life of the track
- Passenger benefit: Improves rail safety, reduces noise and vibration, and reduces long-term maintenance costs
- What is the fix: A series of rail replacements within sections of the trackway at the south end of the system
- What is the expected service impact: Nighttime single tracking in segments between Rainier Beach Station and SeaTac Station (typically 11pm to Service Start). Northbound platform will be closed on night of 6/27.



#### WSDOT Bridge Inspections

Work planned for Sunday, 6/4 (4am to 9am)

WSDOT will be conducting bridge inspections which will require OCS power shutdown in proximity

- Why this is necessary: The WSDOT inspection must be performed during daylight hours.
- Passenger benefit: N/A
- What is the fix: Routine biannual bridge inspection
- What is the expected service impact: Full closure of 4 stations (Stadium to University St). Bus bridging from SODO to Westlake stations



# Passenger Information Systems (PIMS) Testing System (5/31 – 7/3)

Replacing old system reaching end of life

- Why this is necessary: Replace and consolidate end-of-life, incompatible information systems
- Passenger benefit: Continued quality of service to our passengers through better information
- What is the fix: We are system testing for reliability before full transition
- What is the expected service impact: Passengers may experience information that is inaccurate during testing. Real-time info may be down from 6/6 – 6/23.





#### CVS Overhaul Switch Replacement

#### Work planned monthly starting 6/5

Replace cascode voltage switches reaching end of life (in trackway)

- Why this is necessary: Improving switch performance/reliability
- Passenger benefit: Service reliability
- What is the expected service impact: Single tracking from 10pm to end of service. NB platforms at Beacon Hill and Mt. Baker stations closed. 15-minute headways system wide.





# Sounder: Puyallup Station Bulb-out Removal Work planned on 6/6 – 7/3 at Puyallup Sounder Station

Removing station platform bus bulb-out

- Why this is necessary: Bulb out causing impedance to optimal bus flow
- Passenger benefit: Improved bus service
- What is the expected service impact:
   Temporary construction fencing on platform, and surface parking will be partially closed.
   ST and PT bus stops will be temporarily relocated.

3	Othello & Rainier Beach Platform Repair	Rainier Beach - Othello	Safety, Reduces fall hazard
4	26kV System Assessment	Intl Dist Westlake	Safety, Reliability
5	Bond Box Replacement	Intl Dist Westlake	Fewer signal failures, better reliability
6	Rail Replacement	University St - Westlake	Smoother and safer ride
7	System Expansion Improvements	Intl Dist Northgate	Safety, Reliability, Service
8	SeaTac Station Platform Tile Repairs	SeaTac Station	Safety, Reduces fall hazard
