A motion of the Board of the Central Puget Sound Regional Transit Authority region to adopt the revised Mission, Goals, and Objectives.

# Mission, goals and objectives

### **Mission Statement**

The RTA Board of Directors revised its mission statement following voter approval of funding for Sound Move. The revised mission statement reflects that Sound Transit has moved beyond planning for a regional transit system and is now committed to deliver on its promises to the voters. The revised mission statement reads:

"Build and provide for the operation of the regional express bus, commuter rail and light rail services and facilities as described in *Sound Move* to create an integrated regional high-capacity transportation system serving the three-county Sound Transit District. Do so in partnership with public agencies and jurisdictions, relevant private-sector and other interests, and the citizens we serve."

#### Goals and objectives

Sound Transit is organized to achieve the adopted mission and the following goals and objectives:

- Fulfill the commitments of the voter-approved Sound Move plan.
- Adhere to the adopted financial policies.
- Communicate with the public by informing, listening, and responding.
- Create mutually beneficial partnerships to leverage Sound Transit investments and/or reduce costs.

#### Measures of success:

- High quality projects are completed on time and within budget.
- Services are well-used and customer satisfaction is high.
- Audits and other oversight activities assure accountability to the community.
- Staff, consultants, and contractors are accountable to the Sound Transit Board.
- Projects are developed with the help of meaningful community involvement and participation.
- Technical expertise is used to implement the system.
- The organization is lean, reflecting the Sound Transit District's values and diversity.
- Sound Transit uses maximum local participation, including M/W/DBEs in its contracting.
- Projects include innovative design and operating features to attract new riders and benefit Sound Transit's customers.
- Partnerships are created to leverage Sound Transit's investments and/or reduce project costs.
