OBJECTIVE OF ACTION

• To secure construction management services for Central Link, Martin Luther King Jr. Way South. (Contract C735).

ACTION

• Authorizes the Executive Director to execute a contract with Carter & Burgess to provide construction management services along Martin Luther King Jr. Way South in the amount of \$7,864,305 plus a 10% contingency of \$786,430 for a total amount not to exceed \$8,650,735, for a four-year term with the option of two additional one-year extensions.

KEY FEATURES

- Covers construction management for Martin Luther King Jr. Way South (Contract C735).
 Construction includes 4.5 miles of at-grade light rail guideway, and the Edmunds, Othello and Henderson Stations.
- Contract scope includes: providing resident engineering; office engineering; inspection (civil, structural, electrical, track, mechanical, utilities); estimating; change order administration; safety inspection; management; diversity; and Project Labor Agreement (PLA) administration. The total value of construction to be administered under this contract is estimated to be between \$120,000,000 and \$160,000,000.
- This contractor will perform construction management services for undergrounding of Seattle City Light facilities along Martin Luther King (MLK) Jr. Way South. The City of Seattle, Qwest, and Comcast will reimburse Sound Transit \$384,534 for construction management costs for undergrounding work.

BUDGET DISCUSSION

The action considered by this motion authorizes execution of a contract with Carter & Burgess to provide construction management services along MLK Jr. Way South for a total amount not to exceed \$8,650,735, and limits Sound Transit's share of the costs for this work to \$8,266,201.

The total adopted capital budget for the Initial Segment is \$2.07 billion. Within the construction services phase of that budget, the current approved budget for C735 construction management services is \$7,500,000. Per Board Motion No. M2003-90, \$273,118 will be transferred during the 2004 Budget process from the construction phase to cover Sound Transit's share of construction management costs for undergrounding. An additional \$493,084 will be transferred from the systems construction management budget within the construction services phase to fund the remaining shortfall. These budgets have been redistributed within in the Proposed 2004 Budget, and will be subject to Board review and approval this fall.

REVENUE, SUBAREA, AND FINANCIAL PLAN IMPACTS

The proposed action includes work that is part of the Initial Segment of the Central Link project, as well as additional work that will be reimbursed by the City of Seattle, Qwest and Comcast, as authorized by Board Motion No. M2003-90.

Costs related to the additional work being ultimately paid for by the City of Seattle and private utilities will not be charged within the Link Initial Segment, but rather will be tracked separately in order to facilitate project accountability and reimbursement.

Sound Transit's share of the proposed action is covered by the current Board-adopted budget, and is affordable within the agency's current long-term financial plan and subarea financial capacity.

M/W/DBE – SMALL BUSINESS PARTICIPATION

Prime Consultant/Contractor

The M/W/DBE and Small Business Goal for this contract was 30%. For this contract, Carter & Burgess has committed that M/W/DBEs will perform 31.2% of the contract. The contract was negotiated for 37% M/W/DBE and small business participation, however this was reduced when the firm of Garry Struthers Associates graduated from the M/W/DBE program.

It should be noted that, even though one of the previously qualified M/DBE contractors (Garry Struthers Associates) is no longer a M/DBE because of graduation from the M/W/DBE/small business utilization program, the program is a success in that it has helped Garry Struthers Associates to become a valuable firm in the industry as evidenced by Carter & Burgess' continued utilization of Garry Struthers Associates for track inspection and construction safety.

Construction on the MLK Jr. Way South (Contract C735) is expected to start in late 2003. Delay in approving this action beyond two weeks would delay the mobilization of the construction management staff.

REGIONAL PARTNERSHIP AND COOPERATION

Sound Transit has worked cooperatively with the City of Seattle, King County/Metro, Washington State Department of Transportation, the Department of Ecology, and local businesses and interest groups on the Central Link Light Rail Project.
