OBJECTIVE OF ACTION

Secure construction management services for the Downtown Seattle Transit Tunnel (DSTT) Retrofit and Tunnel Expansion and related utility relocations in the Central Link Light Rail Project Initial Segment.

ACTION

Authorize the Chief Executive Officer to execute a contract with URS Corporation to provide construction management services for Contract C510 Downtown Seattle Transit Tunnel Retrofit and Tunnel Expansion and related utility relocations in the amount of \$5,454,500 with a 10% contingency of \$545,450, for a total authorized contract amount not to exceed \$5,999,950.

KEY FEATURES

- URS Corporation will manage construction with an estimated cost between \$60 and \$80 million for the retrofit of the existing DSTT, the construction of a new tunnel section beneath Pine Street, and advanced utility relocation along Pine Street.
- The duration of the contract is for three years with an option for a one-year extension.

BUDGET IMPACT SUMMARY

There is no action outside of the Board-adopted budget; there are no contingency funds required, no subarea impacts, or funding required from other parties other than what is already assumed in the financial plan.

BUDGET DISCUSSION

The proposed action would authorize execution of a new contract with URS Corporation to provide construction management services for Contract C510 Downtown Seattle Transit Tunnel Retrofit and Tunnel Expansion and related utility relocations in the amount of \$5,454,500 with a contingency of \$545,450, for a total authorized contract amount not to exceed \$5,999,950.

The Adopted 2004 Budget for the Central Link Light Rail Project Initial Segment is \$2.07 billion. Within that budget, \$82,737,118 has been set aside for the construction management services phase. Within that phase, \$6,000,000 has been allocated for construction management services for the C510 construction. Should the proposed action be approved, the remaining balance for this budget item will be \$50. Currently, there is an unallocated contingency for the construction services phase in the amount of approximately \$1.25 million.

REVENUE, SUBAREA, AND FINANCIAL PLAN IMPACTS

The proposed action is consistent with the current Board-approved budget and is affordable within Sound Transit's current long-term financial plan and the subarea financial capacity. The action will have no new revenue impacts on Sound Transit.

On November 19, 2003, Sound Transit advertised a Request for Proposal for construction management services on Contract C510 Downtown Seattle Transit Tunnel (DSTT) Retrofit and Tunnel Expansion and C530 Pine Street Early Utility Work of Central Link. On December 18, 2003, Sound Transit received two proposals. Upon evaluation by an inter-agency team, URS Corporation was selected as the firm most qualified to perform this scope of work. The original cost proposal was for \$7,793,674. After negotiations, the final agreed amount was \$5,454,500. The duration of the contract is for three years with an option for a one-year extension.

URS Corporation will manage approximately \$60 to \$80 million worth of construction for the DSTT tunnel retrofit, the construction of the Pine Street stub tunnel, and an early utility relocation contract on Pine Street. The urgency of returning bus operations to the DSTT is the basis of an aggressive construction schedule.

CONSEQUENCES OF DELAY

Delay by the Board in approving this action would have an impact on the start of utility relocation work on Pine Street. This work is an important predecessor to the start of heavy construction on the Pine Street stub tunnel. The bus tunnel retrofit is a critical element of the Central Link Light Rail Project Initial Segment construction schedule.

REGIONAL PARTNERSHIP AND COOPERATION

Sound Transit has worked cooperatively with the City of Seattle, King County, and local businesses and interest groups on the Central Link Light Rail Project. The ongoing cooperation and teamwork exhibited by these groups has contributed to the project moving forward.

PUBLIC INVOLVEMENT

Sound Transit outreach and communications staff continues to keep local and area residents informed about the status of the project and the impact of construction on the neighborhoods.
