<u>ACTION</u>

Authorizes the Chief Executive Officer to execute a contract with Lin and Associates to provide construction management services for the Sammamish Park-and-Ride Lot/228th SE Project in the amount of \$274,964 with a 10% contingency of \$27,496, for a total authorized contract amount not to exceed \$302,460.

KEY FEATURES

- Authorizes the execution of a contract with Lin and Associates for construction management services for the construction of the Sammamish Park-and-Ride Lot to be constructed in the summer of 2005.
- Establishes expectations and defines the scope of work for the construction management services to be provided, including contract administration, field services, monitoring, materials testing, and project close-out.

BUDGET IMPACT SUMMARY

There is no action outside of the Board-adopted budget; there are no contingency funds required, no subarea impacts, or funding required from other parties other than what is already assumed in the financial plan.

BUDGET DISCUSSION

The Sammamish Park-and-Ride Lot project (#380) was included in the Adopted 2005 Budget with a total project budget of \$7.8 million. Within this budget, \$3 million was allocated to the construction phase. After execution of this contract, the phase budget will have a balance of \$2.7 million. This amount is sufficient to complete the remaining aspects of this phase of the project.

REVENUE, SUBAREA, AND FINANCIAL PLAN IMPACTS

The proposed action is consistent with the current Board-adopted budget and is affordable within Sound Transit's current long-term financial plan and the subarea financial capacity. There are no new revenues accruing to Sound Transit associated with this action.

The contract will provide construction management services for the construction of a new parkand-ride lot on the Sammamish Plateau near the 228th Avenue and Issaquah-Pine Lake Road intersection.

Lin and Associates was selected through a standard RFQ process followed by interviews and an RFP.

CONSEQUENCES OF DELAY

The construction contract is scheduled to be advertised in the spring of 2005, with the intent to award it and begin work in early summer 2005. Sound Transit's proposed schedule is for project completion by the end of 2005. A delay in awarding the construction management consultant contract could impact the consultant's pre-construction work in support of the actions needed to get to construction.

PUBLIC INVOLVEMENT

Sound Transit held a public open house in October 2002 to provide information on site alternatives and an opportunity for public comment. A newsletter was mailed to the community in March 2003 providing information on the park-and-ride lot site selection process and the low impact storm water treatment system planned for the project. The City of Sammamish held a public open house in February 2004 to discuss the City's Issaquah-Pine Lake Road extension project (adjacent to the Sound Transit project). Sound Transit staff attended this open house to provide information and answer questions regarding the park-and-ride lot project.
