PROJECT NAME

Mountlake Terrace Freeway Station

PROPOSED ACTION

Authorizes the chief executive officer to execute an agreement with Community Transit to provide a capped funding contribution of \$659,000 for the design and construction of joint improvements at the proposed Community Transit parking garage.

KEY FEATURES of PROPOSED ACTION

- Executes an agreement providing Sound Transit's capped funding obligation of \$659,000 to Community Transit to provide design and construction on the joint garage improvements.
- Allows elements of the transit center project to be built that are needed to support the connection of the freeway station pedestrian bridge to the garage. The contribution will help fund portions of the utilities, fire suppression and parking garage elements that will be used by freeway station customers.
- Establishes an easement from Community Transit for Sound Transit customer access to and through the parking garage and access to inspect the utilities in the parking garage that support the freeway station.

BUDGET and FINANCIAL PLAN DISCUSSION

The Proposed 2008 Budget for this project is \$25,545,383, with a construction phase budget of \$17,210,000. The proposed action will result in a construction phase balance of \$16,516,290 and a project balance of \$17,492,988.

The design team is reviewing the 90% design plan and construction estimate. They are continuing to identify potential reduction in the project scope. Staff expects the costs will increase to a point where consideration for a budget amendment transferring funds from the Snohomish County Program Reserve will be necessary.

PROJECT DESCRIPTION and BACKGROUND for PROPOSED ACTION

Sound Transit is proposing to build a freeway station in the median of I-5, between SR 104 and 220th Street SW, and adjacent to the Mountlake Terrace Transit Center. The freeway station will be built entirely within WSDOT right of way. Pedestrians will access the Mountlake Terrace Freeway Station via a pedestrian bridge, crossing the northbound lanes of I-5 and connecting to a new Community Transit's parking garage and transit center. Community Transit is planning to expand the parking capacity of the transit center by building a four story parking garage on the portion of the site immediately adjacent to I-5. With this improvement, the transit center will provide up to 664 parking stalls.

Sound Transit, Community Transit, the City of Mountlake Terrace, and WSDOT have been working cooperatively for several years to coordinate the designs for the transit center and the freeway station projects in order to provide a clear and convenient connection between the two projects for transit customers. The design for the new garage at the transit center provides a connection point for the freeway station pedestrian bridge. Together, both projects will provide complementary service and provide a seamless transition between the local and regional bus system.

Sound Transit has negotiated a capped contribution to Community Transit in the amount of \$659,000 for those elements to be built as part of the transit center project that are needed to support the connection of the freeway station pedestrian bridge to the garage. The \$659,000 will be paid from the construction phase budget. The contribution will help fund portions of the:

- Utilities
- Fire suppression
- Parking garage elements that will be used by freeway station customers.

On August 28, 2007, Community Transit advertised the transit center project for construction bids. Community Transit opened bids on October 5, 2007 and awarded the construction contract on November 1, 2007. Community Transit completed their environmental documentation for the State Environmental Policy Act (SEPA) and National Environmental Policy Act (NEPA) in the summer of 2006.

Project Status of Sound Transit's Mountlake Freeway Station Project

In November 2006 staff briefed the Finance Committee on increased project costs and committed to return to the Committee after review of possible scope reductions and completion of the 60% design level to provide a project update on project costs and budget. The 60% design, completed in August 2007, included several scope modifications to the 30% plan in order to reduce construction costs. These reductions included:

- Reduce the platform length by 25%, simplifying the roof lines and structural members for easier construction;
- Eliminate a second set of lights on the pedestrian bridge;
- Eliminate the Para glass screening from the pedestrian bridge;
- Redesign and relocate both elevators to eliminate portions of the walkway; and
- Combine elevator machine rooms and replaced some steel components with concrete.

However, even with these scope reductions, the 60% cost estimate continued to exceed the existing construction budget. The overall source of the cost increase was attributed to the rapid rise in general construction costs. Key elements of the 60% plans were sent to a third party for additional technical review to advice Sound Transit on areas to reduce costs. Again, the project team looked to achieve additional construction reductions. The 90% plans included these additional scope reductions:

- Redesign of the major walls,
- Reduction of the transit ramp illumination,
- Modifying materials for pedestrian screening on pedestrian bridge, and
- Reducing the size of the north end station towers.

A 90% design cost estimate was prepared reflecting these additional scope reductions with a funding shortfall now estimated at up to \$9.9 million.

The Sound Transit Proposed 2008 Budget maintains the Mountlake project budget at 2007 levels. The design team will continue to assess the project and seek further scope reduction or design changes to keep the project within budget. We will shortly partner with the WSDOT/Associated General Contractors Structures Committee to seek recommendations on cost reduction and constructability, and we will obtain an additional independent cost estimate. Following completion of final design, we will seek Board direction on whether to supplement the project budget to allow the project to advance into construction. Should the Board approve that action, the project could be advertised for construction in July 2008.

The environmental documentation covered for SEPA and NEPA has been completed. A SEPA Environmental Checklist and Determination of Nonsignificance (DNS) were issued by Sound Transit and the WSDOT in May 2005. A NEPA Documented Categorical Exclusion (DCE) was approved by the Federal Transit Administration and the Federal Highway Administration in November 2005.
