PROJECT NAME

Central Link light rail Initial Segment

PROPOSED ACTION

Authorizes the chief executive officer to execute a contract amendment with PB Americas, Inc., formerly known as Parsons Brinckerhoff Construction Services, Inc., to provide construction management services for the Central Link light rail Initial Segment - Tukwila Freeway Route project in the amount of \$849,516, for a new total authorized contract amount not to exceed \$16,906,673.

KEY FEATURES

- This contract amendment is required to fund an enhanced level of construction management services provided during the course of this contract. To accommodate a very aggressive construction schedule, be fully responsive to and enhance project site safety, and improve project and document control capabilities, additional resources including additional overtime were made necessary.
- This contract amendment is also needed to complete the C755 contract close-out. The original Tukwila Freeway Route construction contract completion date was January 2008. Through a succession of approved time extensions, the contract completion date is now June 30, 2008.
- The contract includes construction management services (e.g., resident engineering, office engineering, cost estimating, field inspection, change order administration, etc.) for the C755 Tukwila Freeway Route project within the Initial Segment with a construction value of approximately \$250 million. The contract also includes construction management services for the C410 Airport Extension to S. 160th Street with a construction value of approximately \$40 million.

BUDGET and FINANCIAL PLAN DISCUSSION

The Adopted 2007 Budget for the Central Link Initial Segment is \$2.07 billion. Within that amount, \$12,250,000 million has been set aside for construction management services for the C755 Tukwila Freeway Route project in the construction services phase.

The proposed action would increase the current commitment for this line item by \$849,516 to a revised total amount of \$13,099,516, and result in a budget shortfall of \$849,516. Approval of the proposed action, when added to other construction services commitments approved by the Sound Transit Board, would result in a budget shortfall of \$3,505,322 for the construction services phase, which would be funded from surplus budget in other phases of the Initial Segment project.

This action, however, is consistent at the phase level with the Proposed 2008 Budget for the Initial Segment project, and is affordable within the agency's current long-term financial plan and subarea financial capacity. The action will have no new revenue impact on Sound Transit.

PROJECT DESCRIPTION and BACKGROUND for PROPOSED ACTION

On January 22, 2004 Sound Transit requested statements of qualification for construction management services for the South Boeing Access Road to South 154th Street line section. On February 24, 2004 Sound Transit received a Statement of Qualifications from eight firms. A selection panel evaluated the written proposals and selected three firms for interviews. The panel considered both the written proposal and the interview, and selected Parsons Brinckerhoff Construction Services, Inc. (now known as PB Americas, Inc.) Following cost/price analyses and negotiations, Sound Transit staff and Parsons Brinckerhoff Construction Services, Inc. reached an agreement, subject to Board approval.

Construction for the South Boeing Access Road to South 154th Street project began in spring 2005. The project includes the construction of at-grade and aerial light rail facilities from the south end of Martin Luther King Jr. Way S. and Boeing Access Road to an aerial station at South 154th Street and International Boulevard in Tukwila. Three large span structures were constructed over I-5, the Burlington Northern Santa Fe and Union Pacific railroad tracks, and the Duwamish River.
