# PROJECT NAME

On-Call Construction and Repair Services

# PROPOSED ACTION

Authorizes the chief executive officer to execute a contract with Cutter, Inc. to provide on-call construction, repair and project services for a total authorized contract amount not to exceed \$500,000.

# KEY FEATURES of PROPOSED ACTION

- This action is required in order to meet the growing demand to repair and replace damaged elements of Sound Transit facilities and property which, if left unattended, could negatively impact the safety of our customers and staff and jeopardize the integrity of the facility. Services will be performed on an as-needed basis via this contract.
- On May 23, 2007, a Limited Notice to Proceed (LNTP) was issued to Cutter, Inc. in the amount of \$100,000 to start work on immediate needs, including maintenance and repair of occupied buildings on property acquired for the Link Capitol Hill Station, pavement repairs in the Tacoma Link system, and several other Sounder and Regional Express station repairs.
- The contract provides for a one-year contract period with four options to extend, each for an additional one-year term.

 The contract scope of work with Cutter, Inc., includes: general labor; carpentry; asphalt repair and installation; concrete repair and installation; repair and installation of fencing; repair of damaged landscape; painting of repaired/damaged station canopies and other structures; repair/replacement of damaged tiles/pavers station areas; welding of damaged steel structures; site clean-up; minor structural work as needed and installation of shelving; storage bins; pallet rack and the required seismic bracing; management of general requirements (i.e. safety, security, traffic management, temporary facilities & utilities); provide preventative and planned maintenance of all security systems as well as repairs not covered by a warranty; provide sweeping of parking lots; provide snow plowing and de-icing as required; and perform cleaning and maintenance of all storm drains and environmental systems.

# **BUDGET IMPACT SUMMARY**

There is no action outside of the Board-adopted budget; there are no contingency funds required, no subarea impacts, or funding required from other parties other than what is already assumed in the financial plan.

# **BUDGET and FINANCIAL PLAN DISCUSSION**

The proposed action would provide on-call maintenance and repair services for various Sound Transit facilities. These services are budgeted for in the non-capitalizable costs section of the budget and within the station maintenance costs section of the transit operations budgets for each mode.

The Adopted 2007 Budget includes \$84.0 million for non-capitalizable costs. Of this amount, \$75,000 is included for property management costs for properties owned but not under construction or in revenue service. The Adopted 2007 Budget included \$2.8 million in funding for the maintenance of station components of transit operations. Of this amount, \$128,000 was budgeted for on-call maintenance services. Through June 14, 2007, \$11,000 had been committed to these services. The remaining balance of the 2007 budget will be used to fund the first year of the \$100,000 contract with Cutter, Inc. The remaining balance of the contract will be funded through the 2008 and future non-capitalizable cost and transit operations budgets.

# **BUDGET TABLE**

The budget for non-capitalizable costs appears on page 216 of the Adopted 2007 Budget book. The transit operations budget table appears on page 47 of the Adopted 2007 Budget book. The impact of this contract on the 2007 transit operations budget and future requirements is illustrated below.

# PROJECT DESCRIPTION and BACKGROUND for PROPOSED ACTION

Sound Transit has a growing demand for the repair and maintenance of a variety of facilities, including a recent acquisition of properties for the Link Capitol Hill Station. The thirteen newly acquired properties include parking lots, active businesses, and tenant occupied apartment buildings. In addition, Sound Transit has a growing number of transit facilities that need to be maintained in safe working order.

This contract provides for on-call construction and repair services for various Sound Transit facilities, including park-and-ride lots, Sounder, Link light rail, HOV freeway stations, operations and maintenance buildings and Union Station. The services may include the following types of work:

- carpentry;
- welding;
- site clean-up;
- installation of shelving, storage bins, pallet racks and seismic bracing; and
- repairs to station canopies and related structures, asphalt, concrete, paint, landscaping, fencing

These services will provide Sound Transit with the ability to respond to emergency situations and provide for necessary repair and maintenance of Sound Transit facility assets.

# **CONSEQUENCES of DELAY**

A delay beyond July 19, 2007 may require immediate suspension of the on-call construction repair and project services.

### Background:

Sound Transit has a growing demand for the repair and maintenance of a variety of facilities, including a recent acquisition of properties for the Link Capitol Hill Station. The thirteen newly acquired properties include parking lots, active businesses, and tenant occupied apartment buildings. In addition, Sound Transit has a growing number of transit facilities that need to be maintained in safe working order.

This contract provides for on-call construction and repair services for various Sound Transit facilities; including park-and-ride lots, Sounder, Link light rail, HOV freeway stations, operations and maintenance buildings and Union Station. The services may include the following types of work:
