PROJECT NAME

Central Link Initial Segment

ACTION

Authorizes the chief executive officer to increase the contingency for the contract with PB Americas, Inc. (previously Parsons Brinckerhoff Construction Services, Inc.) to provide continuing construction management services of the Beacon Hill Station and Tunnel civil construction contract, in the amount of \$3,011,427, for a new total authorized contract amount not to exceed \$18,600,000.

KEY FEATURES

- The request for an increase in contingency is due to, in large part, the construction of the Beacon Hill Station and Tunnel taking longer to complete than originally anticipated by the contract. Thus, because construction management oversight duration is tied directly to the duration of the contractor's construction period, the duration for which the construction management team's presence is required on site must be extended to coincide with that of the construction.
- In addition, there are increased costs due to increased work loads for the following contract functions:
 - safety representative;
 - estimating;
 - scheduling;
 - equipment commissioning and electrical systems issues resolution;
 - diversity support; and
 - additional administrative support.
- This amendment will provide additional funds to continue the on-going normal construction management services for the Beacon Hill Station and Tunnel.

BUDGET DISCUSSION

The Adopted 2008 Lifetime Capital Budget for the Central Link Initial Segment is \$2.07 billion. Within that amount \$16,600,000 has been set aside for construction management services for the Beacon Hill Station and Tunnel civil construction contract (C710) in the construction services phase.

The proposed action would increase current commitments for this line item by \$3,011,427 for a revised total commitment of \$18,600,000, and result in a budget shortfall of \$2,000,000 for this task, amounting to a shortfall of \$1,492,056 for the total construction services phase. Since there is no unallocated contingency remaining in the construction services phase, the budget shortfall would be funded from surplus budget within other phases of the Initial Segment project. However, the proposed action is within the task budget set aside for this line item in the construction services phase of the Proposed 2009 Budget.

The proposed action is within the current adopted budget for this project and the Proposed 2009 Budget, and is affordable within the agency's long-term financial plan and subarea financial capacity. The action will have no new revenue impact on Sound Transit.

PROJECT DESCRIPTION and BACKGROUND for PROPOSED ACTION

Construction for Beacon Hill started in the summer of 2004. The Beacon Hill Station and Tunnel contract includes the construction of light rail facilities in tunnel and on aerial structures from Airport Way South through Beacon Hill to a location near the intersection of Rainier Avenue and Martin Luther King Way. It also includes the construction of the Beacon Hill Station (underground) and the Mt. Baker Station (aerial structure).

The construction management services provided under this contract have been supplemented with Sound Transit staff, and provide:

- highly specialized sequential excavation mining inspectors
- an environmental oversight consultant
- a quality assurance surveying consultant
- a quality assurance testing laboratory

Previously the Central Link Oversight Committee and the Sound Transit Board have been provided briefings concerning the construction contractor's progress on the contract. Sound Transit is forecasting substantial completion by May 2009 with acceptance to follow one month later. The May 2009 substantial completion does not impact revenue operation service in July 2009 as the critical systems will be operational and tested prior to that date.

This increase in the contract contingency is necessary due to the following factors:

- The construction of the Beacon Hill Station and Tunnel is taking longer to complete than originally anticipated by the contract. Thus, because construction management oversight duration is tied directly to the duration of the construction period, the duration for which the construction management team's presence is required on site must be extended to coincide with that of the construction contractor.
- Increased costs due to increased work loads for the following contract functions:
 - Safety Representative
 - Estimating
 - Scheduling
 - o Commissioning and Electrical Systems Issues Resolution
 - Diversity Support
 - o Additional Administrative Support

M2004-01 1/15/04	Authorized the Chief Executive Officer to execute a contract with Parsons Brinckerhoff Construction Services, Inc. to provide construction management services for Contract C710, Beacon Hill Project in the amount of \$14,171,430 and authorize use of a 10% contingency in the amount of \$1,417,143, for a total authorized expenditure amount not to exceed \$15,588,573.

CONSEQUENCES OF DELAY

Construction is underway for the Beacon Hill Station and Tunnel. PB Americas, Inc. is essential for construction management, administration and oversight of construction during the construction period. Without the continuing support of PB Americas, Inc., Sound Transit would not be able to effectively and efficiently manage the construction being performed by the civil construction contractor and its subcontractors, nor would it be able to effectively and efficiently coordinate the construction of the systems contractors with those of the civil contractor. A delay in Finance Committee action and Board approval in December could impact the orderly management and oversight of construction activities.

PUBLIC INVOLVEMENT

Sound Transit continues to work cooperatively with the City of Seattle, King County Metro, Washington State Department of Transportation, the Department of Ecology, and local businesses and interest groups on the Central Link Light Rail Project. Sound Transit staff continues to keep local and area residents informed about the status of the project and the impact of construction on the affected neighborhoods.
