PROJECT NAME

East Link (Phase II Planning Project – East Corridor)

PROPOSED ACTION

Authorizes the chief executive officer to execute a task order for the East Link project under the Link design services umbrella agreement with Washington State Department of Transportation. The task order will provide engineering support, plan reviews, and real estate/permit actions related to the development of the East Link preliminary engineering and final environmental impact statement (EIS) preparation in the amount of \$597,657, with a contingency of \$23,500, for a total authorized amount not to exceed \$621,157.

KEY FEATURES of PROPOSED ACTION

- Defines a scope of work for Washington State Department of Transportation (WSDOT) project coordination, design and environmental reviews and documentation, and agreement activities related to East Link preliminary engineering and final Environmental Impact Statement (EIS) preparation. The schedule extends through the completion of the final EIS.
- This work will refine the analysis of the light rail routes between downtown Seattle and downtown Redmond, including preliminary engineering and final environmental documentation for the East Link project. The East Link project will construct light rail facilities within the right of way of Interstate 90, Interstate 405 and SR 520.
- WSDOT is participating as a State Environmental Policy Act (SEPA) co-lead on the East Link EIS.
- Planning for the East Link Project requires the support of WSDOT traffic, design, environmental, operations, and maintenance staff. Under this task order WSDOT staff will coordinate work between the state and Sound Transit, provide access and traffic control coordination, participate in reviews of structural design, geotechnical/material engineering, traffic engineering, construction staging, drainage and utility design, stations, landscaping, and urban design, and operations and maintenance

issues. WSDOT will also perform right of way activities, review the final environmental document, and assist in identifying required agreements and permits.

The task order assumes that WSDOT staff will perform 100% of the work under this contract.
 WSDOT has indicated that their intent is to work collaboratively with Sound Transit and its consultants, but in some specialized areas they may request consultant assistance to review designs.
 If consultant assistance is needed, it will come from contingency or need added funds.

There is no action outside of the Board-adopted budget; there are no contingency funds required, no subarea impacts, or funding required from other parties other than what is already assumed in the financial plan.

BUDGET and FINANCIAL PLAN DISCUSSION

The Adopted 2009 Budget for the East Link project is \$55,472,914, of which \$23,000,000 is operating budget and \$32,472,914 is capital budget. There is a pending ST2 amendment which would add \$23,527,825 to the capital project budget, including \$800,000 in Third Party Agreements. The proposed action is to execute a task order with WSDOT for an amount not to exceed \$621,157. If these funds are needed prior to the ST2 amendment going before the Board, budget from the East Link operating budget will be used for the task order leaving a balance of \$3,894,398.

There are sufficient funds to complete this action within the project's budget. Committing these funds will not endanger any other project elements that are to be funded out of the overall project.

SMALL BUSINESS PARTICIPATION

WSDOT staff plans to complete 100% of the work under this contract. However, if WSDOT elects to secure consultant services, WSDOT's small business utilization policies, programs, and practices will apply.

PROJECT DESCRIPTION and BACKGROUND for PROPOSED ACTION

East Link is a project to provide light rail transit between Seattle, Bellevue, and Redmond via I-90 and Mercer Island. On May 14, 2009 the Board identified the preferred light rail routes and stations for the final EIS.

On October 12, 2006, the Sound Transit Board authorized the Chief Executive Officer to (1) amend the umbrella agreement with the WSDOT for design review services of Link projects to include all geographical areas within the Sound Transit district and include current federal clauses; and (2) remove monetary limits established in Motion No. M2002-50. The structure established between Sound Transit and WSDOT through the umbrella agreement for design has worked well for both agencies. This task order will continue the working relationship on the East Link project.

A motion of the Finance Committee of the Central Puget Sound Regional Transit Authority authorizing the chief executive officer to execute a task order for the East Link project under the Link design services umbrella agreement with Washington State Department of Transportation. The task order will provide engineering support, plan reviews, and real estate/permit actions related to the development of the East Link preliminary engineering and final environmental impact statement (EIS) preparation in the amount of \$597,657, with a contingency of \$23,500, for a total authorized amount not to exceed \$621,157.

Background:

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Evaluation of the alternative project routes, stations, and maintenance facility locations identified by the Board will be conducted in cooperation with the Federal Transit Administration (FTA) and WSDOT. Before committing federal funds to the East Link project, the FTA is required to undertake environmental review in compliance with the National Environmental Policy Act (NEPA). As the public agency proposing the East Link project, Sound Transit is required to comply with SEPA. The FTA, as the federal lead agency under NEPA, and Sound Transit, as the state lead agency under SEPA, have determined that alternative routes and stations in the project may have probable significant adverse environmental impacts.
