

# **MOTION NO. M2011-76** Labor Agreement for Tacoma Link Light Rail Vehicle Operators

### **PROPOSED ACTION**

Authorizes the chief executive officer to execute a three-year labor agreement with the Amalgamated Transit Union Local 758 covering Tacoma Link Light Rail vehicle operators.

### **KEY FEATURES**

- This labor agreement will cover seven Light Rail Vehicle (LRV) Operators of Tacoma Link and any new operator positions created in the next three years. Tacoma Link LRV Operators are unique within the agency – they are the only public transit operators managed directly by Sound Transit.
- Sound Transit and the ATU 758 have negotiated the agreement over the course of the past several months after the current labor contract expired on October 6, 2011.
- The new labor agreement includes clarification of previous language regarding to seniority, grievance procedure, and progressive discipline and other provisions similar. The agreement also establishes new salary rates for the three year period and a provision that union members will participate in the same benefit and cost containment measures implemented during the contract as all other ST employees.
- On October 23, 2011, the tentative labor agreement was presented to union members and it was accepted. As part of the agreement, Sound Transit agreed to make the contract provisions retroactive to October 1, 2011.

### **PROJECT DESCRIPTION**

Tacoma Link is a 1.6-mile line running between the Tacoma Dome Station and downtown Tacoma. It opened for service in August 2003, and serves the University of Washington's Tacoma campus, the Washington State History Museum, the Tacoma Art Museum, the Museum of Glass, the Convention Center, downtown offices and the Broadway Theater District. Tacoma Link is operated by Sound Transit employees represented by the ATU 758.

#### **FISCAL INFORMATION**

Tacoma Link LRV operator wages and benefits are covered in the Tacoma Link operations budget.

The 2011 budget for Tacoma link wages and benefits is \$1,739,290. The spending through September was \$1,234,828, or 95% of the year-to-date budget. The estimated impacts of this action are affordable within the existing 2011 budget.

The 2012 proposed budget for wages and benefits is \$1,774,122. The budget assumes a 3% increase for operators to anticipate the impacts of this labor agreement when it was developed and is affordable in the financial plan.

Future years will be funded through the Service Delivery operations budget in accordance with the terms of the contract and current economic assumptions.

There is no Small Business goal or commitment related to this labor agreement.

### EQUAL EMPLOYMENT WORKFORCE PROFILE

6 employees; 16% women; 33% minorities.
