PROPOSED ACTION

Authorizes the chief executive officer to execute a contract with Motorola Inc., to provide and install radio console equipment for the University Link project in the amount of \$1,117,896, with a 10% contingency of \$111,790, for a total authorized contract amount not to exceed \$1,229,686.

KEY FEATURES

- Under this contract, Motorola Inc., will provide and install new radio equipment to be used in the Link Control Center (LCC) and Back-up Control Center.
- The new radio system will allow continuous communications between the LCC, light rail vehicles, buses operated by King County Metro, and operations and maintenance staff in the field. This system is required for safe operations of the light rail system and is essential in responding to life safety events.
- The new radio console equipment will maintain compatibility with the King County Metro radio system when the present bus radio system is replaced. The equipment will also allow enhanced communications capability with Emergency Responders.

PROJECT DESCRIPTION

University Link (U-Link) is a 3.15-mile light rail extension located entirely underground with tunnels traveling east from Pine Street, under the I-5 freeway to an underground station at Capitol Hill, continuing north beneath SR 520 and the Lake Washington Ship Canal to an underground station on the UW campus, near Husky Stadium.

FISCAL INFORMATION

Consistent with the U-Link forecast cost at completion, this action and remaining contracts for construction are within the project phase approved budget.

BACKGROUND

The Link light rail radio system is operated through the King County Radio System (KCRS) with connections to the King County Metro radio system that communicates with buses in the

Downtown Seattle Transit Tunnel (DSTT). Radio consoles allow for operation between other life safety agencies operating on the KCRS radio system in the event of a major emergency.

In October 2011, an invitation for bid was advertised for a radio console contract and one bid was submitted. Motorola was found to be responsive and responsible. Notice to proceed is anticipated in March 2012 and be substantially complete before March 2013.
