PROPOSED ACTION

- Confirms authorization of payment of shared expenses related to the Interlocal Cooperation Agreement for the Design, Implementation, Operation and Maintenance of the Regional Fare Coordination System (ILA) based on the annual amount approved by the Sound Transit Board through adoption of the annual budget;
- 2. Authorizes the chief executive officer to use the remaining amount of the ERG/Vix contract of \$4,384,016 for Sound Transit specific expenditures that are not paid through the ILA; and
- 3. Confirms the chief executive officer's authority to serve as a member of the Joint Administrative Board created under the ILA.

KEY FEATURES SUMMARY

- In 2003, the Board authorized the chief executive officer to enter into an Interlocal Cooperation Agreement for the Design, Implementation, Operation and Maintenance of the Regional Fare Coordination System (ILA) with King County Metro, Community Transit, Everett Transit, Kitsap Transit, Pierce Transit, and Washington State Ferries. The ILA created the framework for a fare collection system and provided for the administration and oversight of the operation and payment of the agencies' shared costs. The system is now known as ORCA.
- Under the ILA, regional costs are shared among the agencies. In 2009, a restated and amended ILA was executed to update the agreement for the operating phase of the ORCA project. Since 2009, Sound Transit's share of the regional expenses under the ERG/Vix contract has been approved by the Board through adoption of the annual budgets.
- This action confirms authorization of payment of shared expenses based on the annual amount approved by the Sound Transit Board through adoption of the annual budget.
- Motion No. M2003-24 authorized execution of a contract with ERG Transit Systems (ERG) to design, implement, and operate a regional based fare collection and processing system and authorized an amount not to exceed \$6,644,931 for Sound Transit's share of the vendor services. In 2011 ERG's name was changed to Vix Technology. Vix Technology is continuing to do work under the contract.
- This action authorizes the chief executive officer to use the remaining \$4,384,016 in the contract for Sound Transit agency-specific costs that are not paid through the ILA. Agency-specific costs include new equipment for Sound Transit's system expansion, system modifications specific to Sound Transit operations, and repairs or maintenance of Sound Transit devices.
- This action also confirms the chief executive officer's actions as a member of the Joint Board while administering and overseeing the ORCA project under the ILA.

BACKGROUND

On April 24, 2003, the Sound Transit Board approved two actions related to the Smart Card project (now known as ORCA). Motion No. M2003-25 authorized an ILA between Sound Transit, King County Metro, Community Transit, Everett Transit, Kitsap Transit, Pierce Transit, and Washington State Ferries. The ILA created the framework for a fare collection system and provided for the administration and oversight of the operation and payment of the agencies' shared costs. The ILA established a Joint Administrative Board (Joint Board), consisting of Sound Transit's chief executive officer and the general managers of each participating agency to provide oversight and administration. Annually, the Joint Board, with the Sound Transit chief executive officer participating, adopts an annual budget of regionally shared costs.

In 2008, the Board authorized a contract change order under the ERG/Vix contract in the amount of \$237,000 for the vendor to provide added ORCA functionality for Sound Transit ticket vending machines. The total amount was increased to \$6,881,931.

From 2003 to 2009, the regional shared operational support services costs and Sound Transit specific costs under the ERG/Vix contract have been charged against Sound Transit's share of the vendor services. Since 2009, Sound Transit's share of the regional expenses of the ILA and the ERG/Vix contract have been included in an annual budget submitted to the Sound Transit Board for adoption. Expenses budgeted under the ILA have included operations and maintenance expenses set forth in the ERG/Vix contract, regionally shared expenses of the participating agencies, regional shared operational support services provided by Sound Transit and King County Metro, and local retailers selling ORCA products. The regional support services provided by Sound Transit and King County Metro include the regional program administration, the fiscal agent duties, ORCA operations, the mail center and the regional distribution and inventory center. Expenses are allocated to each agency under the ILA based on an annual proportionate operating share calculated based on each agencies' ridership from the previous year. All Sound Transit expenditures have been within Sound Transit Board adopted budgets.

In February 2009, the Sound Transit Board approved Motion No. M2009-16 authorizing execution of a restated and amended ILA to update the agreement for the operating phase of the ORCA project to further define the agencies' responsibilities during the operations period after full system acceptance. Sound Transit's share of the regionally shared costs has continued to grow due to the increase in ridership and is currently 19.39%, up from the original estimate in 2003 of 7.6%. Sound Transit's ridership has increased as a result of service expansions and the reduction in service by Sound Transit's partner agencies.

FISCAL INFORMATION

The actions described above explain and reaffirm the contract spending regarding the expenses associated with the ORCA project, including the ERG/Vix contract. All ORCA related expenditures to date have been within Board-approved levels.

Additionally, this action authorizes the chief executive officer to use the remaining amount of the ERG/Vix contract of \$4,384,016 for Sound Transit specific use in future purchases under the ERG/Vix contract, which expires in 2021. Below is displayed the \$778,785 of future expected expenditures for 2014-2016 and where the funding lies to cover these expenditures.

There is sufficient budget to cover the 2014 operating expenses. Future year expenses will be included in subsequent annual budgets submitted to the Board for adoption.

Approval is needed as soon as possible to clarify the authority to pay for agency specific purchases under the ERG/Vix contract.

PRIOR BOARD/COMMITTEE ACTIONS

Motion No. M2009-16: Authorizing the chief executive officer to execute a restated and amended interlocal agreement for the Smart Card project with Community Transit, Everett Transit, Kitsap Transit, King County Metro Transit, Pierce Transit, and Washington State Ferries to update the agreement for the operating phase to further define the agencies' responsibilities during the operations period.

<u>Motion No. M2008-17</u>: Authorized the chief executive officer to execute a contract change order under an existing contract with ERG Transit Systems (USA) Inc. to provide added functionality for smart card dispensing and multiple product purchases from Sound Transit's Ticket Vending Machines, in the amount \$215,000 with a contingency of \$22,000 totaling \$237,000, for a new total authorized amount not to exceed \$6,881,931. This change order amount is for Sound Transit's capital expense share under the seven-agency Smart Card vendor contract.

<u>Motion No. M2007-127</u>: Authorizing the chief executive officer to execute an amendment to the Regional Pass and Fare Reconciliation Program Agreement with Community Transit, Everett Transit, King County Metro and Pierce Transit for regional fare media acceptance and reconciliation of Puget Pass revenues to add three additional one-year optional extension periods to the agreement term.

Motion No. M2003-24: Authorized the Executive Director to execute a contract with ERG Transit Systems (USA) Inc., a California corporation and wholly-owned subsidiary of ERG Limited, an Australian systems integration and transit fare collection equipment vendor, to design, implement and operate a regional Smart Card-based fare collection and revenue processing system for Central Puget Sound transit agencies. This contract would include \$3,279,008 for system design and implementation and all equipment, plus \$2,712,854 in payments for operations and maintenance of the system through 2014, and an 11% contingency amount of \$653,069, for a total authorized contract amount of \$6,644,931. (ERG changed its name to Vix Technology in 2011.) <u>Motion No. M2003-25</u>: Authorized the Executive Director to execute an interlocal agreement regarding the Smart Card project with partner transit agencies, which may include Community Transit, Everett Transit, Kitsap Transit, King County Metro, Pierce Transit, and Washington State Ferries.

<u>Motion No. M2003-26</u>: Authorized the Executive Director to allocate funding from the Regional Fund/Fare Integration Fund budget to provide Smart Card project funding for Sound Transit implementation and operations; to provide funding support to Community Transit, Everett Transit, and Pierce Transit; and to renegotiate the Regional Pass and Fare Reconciliation Program Agreement to reduce and sunset Sound Transit's participation in the Puget Pass program and obligation to subsidize intersystem transfers.

A motion of the Board of the Central Puget Sound Regional Transit Authority (1) confirming authorization of payment of shared expenses related to the Interlocal Cooperation Agreement for the Design, Implementation, Operation and Maintenance of the Regional Fare Coordination System (ILA) based on the annual amount approved by the Sound Transit Board through adoption of the annual budget; (2) authorizing the chief executive officer to use the remaining amount of the ERG/Vix contract of \$4,384,016 for Sound Transit specific expenditures that are not paid through the ILA; and (3) confirming the chief executive officer's authority to serve as a member of the Joint Administrative Board created under the ILA.
