# **PROPOSED ACTION**

Authorizes the chief executive officer to execute a contract with Potelco Inc. for the relocation of a 115kV aerial transmission line at Northgate within the Northgate Link Extension in the amount of \$2,811,927, with a 10% contingency of \$281,193, for a total authorized contract amount not to exceed \$3.093,120.

#### **KEY FEATURES SUMMARY**

- The proposed action would relocate the Seattle City Light (SCL) 115kV aerial transmission line, currently located along 1<sup>st</sup> Avenue NE in the vicinity of the Northgate Mall, to the west edge of the WSDOT I-5 ROW between NE 105<sup>th</sup> Street to NE 115<sup>th</sup> Street.
- Relocation of the transmission line eliminates the conflict with the proposed Northgate Link Extension elevated guideway along 1<sup>st</sup> Avenue NE.
- The scope of work includes removing five existing utility poles and approximately 3,200 feet of 3-wire conductor, installing eight steel poles and 3,000 feet of 3-wire conductor, and constructing vehicular access pads for future SCL maintenance activities.
- With most of the work occurring in the I-5 right-of-way, detailed traffic control plans and close coordination with WSDOT, SCL and the State Patrol will be essential duties of the contractor.

### **BACKGROUND**

Northgate Link extends light rail 4.3-miles from the University of Washington Station north under the campus via twin-bored tunnels to an underground station in the University District (U District Station). The alignment continues to an underground station along 12th Avenue NE between NE 65th Street and NE 67th Street (Roosevelt Station) and then to an elevated station east of 1st Avenue NE, spanning NE 103rd Street (Northgate Station).

The Northgate Link Extension includes an elevated guideway that will be constructed as part of the Northgate Station, Elevated Guideway, and Parking Garage contract. The new elevated guideway along 1st Avenue NE, near the Northgate Mall, will conflict with an existing SCL 115kV aerial transmission line. The work under this contract would eliminate this conflict by relocating the existing aerial line to the west edge of I-5.

Sound Transit issued an Invitation for Bids (IFB) on February 17<sup>th</sup>, 2016 and three bids were received on March 24, 2016. Potelco Inc. was determined to be the lowest responsive, responsible bidder with a bid price of \$2,811,927. The engineer's estimate was \$1,631,820. The contractor's bid price appears to reflect higher costs to provide access for power line maintenance by SCL, additional costs for traffic control, and other added costs associated with working in the I-5 right of way, including requirements to work at night.

The Northgate Link Extension SEPA Addendum to the North Link Final Supplemental Environmental Impact Statement (2006) was published in July 2015 providing additional environmental analysis and information on relocating the 115kV aerial transmission line. The Northgate Link Extension is scheduled to be completed in September 2021 and will provide an interim terminus for Link at Northgate until the Lynnwood Link Extension is in service, currently anticipated in 2023.

# **FISCAL INFORMATION**

This action is within the adopted budget and sufficient monies remain after approval of the action to fund the remaining work in the Construction phase as contained in the current cost estimates of this project.

The lifetime budget in the 2016 Transportation Improvement Plan (TIP) for the Northgate Link Extension is \$1,899,755,500. Within that amount, \$3,500,000 has been set aside for N113 Overhead Power Relocation at Northgate in the Construction phase. The proposed action would increase the commitment of \$156,459 for this line item by \$3,093,120 to a revised total commitment of \$3,249.579, and leave a remaining budget balance of \$250,421.

Consistent with Board's Budget policy, staff transferred \$500,000 from Construction phase unallocated contingency to N113 Overhead Power Relocation at Northgate. This transfer within the Construction phase budget of the project took place in April 2016 to provide sufficient budget for this line item to fund the proposed action.

# **PUBLIC INVOLVEMENT**

Sound Transit has maintained an active community outreach program during construction, which includes a 24-hours/7-days-a-week construction hotline, a variety of written materials, and public meetings.

Sound Transit staff has been notifying affected stakeholders and the public about the construction work related to this project. Staff will continue to work closely with local jurisdictions to coordinate public notification efforts and other outreach activities during construction.

# **TIME CONSTRAINTS**

A one month delay in awarding this contract could delay follow-on work required by Seattle City Light and storage costs for power poles procured under a separate contract.
