2019 Highlight - Planet

Growing regional benefits



2% more GHG savings than 2018

1 ton ST GHG emissions averts 5.8 tons GHGs in region



Regional emissions avoided when riders take Sound Transit Agency emissions from operations



Regional environmental benefits

ST services avoid GHG emissions equivalent to:



Powering more than **66,000 homes** for a year



Burning **44 million** gallons of gasoline



2019 Highlight - Planet

Resource conservation and renewables

- Reduced GHG emissions 4% overall launch of Green Direct renewable energy purchase from Puget Sound Energy.
- Researched and identified implementation opportunities for fleet electrification.





2019 Highlight - Planet

Environmental Stewardship



- Maintained strong environmental compliance record
- Brought salmon back to Coal Creek in Bellevue
- Returned two large areas of Ronald Bog in Shoreline back to wetlands
- Improved salmon habitat on Green River tributary



2019 Highlight - Prosperity

- Operating efficiently
- Since 2007, 18+ energy and fuel efficiency projects create \$620,000+ in annual savings
- Using green building standards to reduce embodied carbon in stations by 10%





2019 Annual Targets

People

- Contribute \$4 million to an affordable housing revolving loan fund.
- Sign agreement with the Seattle Office of Housing for affordable home ownership projects on agency surplus property in the Rainier Valley.
- Adopt Equity Policy and strategic plan.
- Fully implement inclusion and EEO staff training.
- Conduct a pay equity audit.
- M Implement workplace flexibility policy.
- Complete System Access Strategic Plan.
- Update the noise mitigation policy and associated project delivery noise and vibration protocols.

Planet

- Power Link light rail with 100% clean energy.
- ☑ Initiate battery electric bus feasibility study for ST bus services.
- Develop and initiate nonrevenue fleet electrification plan.
- Join West Coast Electric Fleets, pledging to expand use of zero-emission vehicles.
- Complete four energy efficiency projects at existing sites/facilities.
- Evaluate agency properties for known or potential contamination and establish a closeout strategy.

Prosperity

- Conduct Climate Vulnerability Assessment for West Seattle to Ballard Link Extension project.
- ☑ Initiate LEED Existing Building Operations and Maintenance certification process for Union Station.
- Enable Procurement and Contracts staff to use e-signature to execute contracts.
- Receive 30% of informal Procurement and Contracts offers (bids, quotes or proposals) electronically.
- ✓ Increase the number of solicitations that use green procurement methods by 10% over 2018 levels.
- Document protocols for archaeological compliance during construction.
- Propose a procedure to implement Total Cost of Ownership analysis within the agency.

- Completed 80% of targets
- All remaining targets will be completed in 2020

- Finalize guidance for sustainability in ST3 projects within the context of changing budgets and timelines.
- Implement resource efficiency and carbon-reduction projects.
 - Revise agency's Sustainability KPIs in light of Covid-19
- Increase collaboration with CREI
