- Resolution 2023-02 Establish Project Baseline






- 2008 ST2 projects long awaited by cities and voters and have local support
- Identified by the Board as Tier 1 projects in the 2021 realignment action
- Sounder S Line serves a large geographic area
- Access to Sounder stations and transit centers
- Majority of Sounder riders arrive by car
- Pre-pandemic parking demand exceeded capacity

Access to Transit Centers

- Customers can currently connect to 12 bus routes in Kent, 8 in Auburn and 2 in Sumner
- King County Metro is bringing the new Rapid Ride I-Line to Kent & Auburn Stations (by 2026)
- Sumner has contracted with a transit provider for local shuttle service that will connect to the Sumner Sounder Station

- Baseline Sumner, Kent and Auburn as one project
- Alternative Concept Allowance


