## **Proposed action**

Appointing Trevor Reed to the Community Oversight Panel to serve a term of three years beginning August 1, 2024, and expiring July 31, 2027.

## **Key features summary**

- In January 2024, Community Oversight Panel member Carston Curd resigned with approximately one year and six months left on his term. He represented the East King County geographical subarea, leaving a vacancy on the panel.
- Recruitment to fill the vacancy began following Carston Curd's resignation.
- This would be the first term for Mr Reed. If willing and able, is eligible to serve two additional threeyear terms.
- Mr. Reed currently lives in the East King County subarea.

# **Background**

The Sound Transit Community Oversight Panel (the "COP") is a 15-member advisory committee of community volunteers appointed by the Sound Transit Board to monitor and report on Sound Transit's performance in delivering on the commitments it made in Sound Move, ST2, and ST3. The COP is charged with an annual review of Sound Transit's performance and financial plan and provides reports and recommendations to the Board.

The current responsibilities include monitoring Sound Transit's performance in the following areas:

- Community engagement activities
- Project planning and alignment decisions
- Budget and financial plan
- Project schedule and budget adherence

A motion of the Board of the Central Puget Sound Regional Transit Authority appointing Trevor Reed to the Community Oversight Panel to serve a term of three years beginning August 1, 2024, and expiring July 31, 2027.

## **Background**
