## Safety and Security Data

#### Safety Event Types:

Collisions (with transit vehicle)	Fatalities (confirmed within 30 days, includes suicide)
Derailments (mainline or yard)	Fire
Property damage (substantial)	Evacuations (for life safety, or into right-of-way)
Injuries (with transport for medical attention and one or more persons)	





# Safety and Security Data

#### Security Event Types:

Arson	Assault
Bomb threat/bombing	Homicide
Burglary / vandalism	Robbery
Sabotage	Larceny/theft
Suspicious package	Motor vehicle theft


Fully compliant with the regulatory Federal, State, and agency requirements

 Monthly cadence to REO Committee on Safety & Security data




#### Transportation Safety and Security

- Injuries and collisions have reduced in the first half of 2024
- Collision events are mostly out of agency control (such as inclement weather and left-turn movements in front of transit vehicles) and data could reflect an increase
- Use of data has resulted in a decrease in emergency door pulls (evacuations)





#### Employee Health & Safety


- Employee injuries have reduced in the first half of 2024
- Full agency implementation of training modules, use of Employee Safety Reporting Tool (ESRT)
- Improved Fare Ambassador on-board safety training

- Below the Capital Program goal, National, and WA state averages
- Reportable Injury Rate (.60)
- Lost Time Injury Rate (.07)









## Public Safety

- Comparable assault data (3-year trends) will be available in 2026.










 Fare Ambassadors and Security received training to aid in identifying individuals in crisis and report accordingly


#### **Contracted Support**
