Why we're here

What we've been up to

Unprecedented system growth

Three light rail openings in one year.

76% more stations than a year ago.

- 18 new stations.
- From 25 to 43 total stations.

Link goes 60% farther than a year ago.

- 17 new miles of track.
- From 28 to 45 total miles.









Access to opportunity

In just one year, **173,000 more people** now live within one mile of a Link station.

- 70,000 people near the eight new 2 Line stations.
- 68,000 within a mile of the four new 1 Line stations.
- 35,000 within one mile of the six new T Line stations.



Catalyzing development

- 3,470 total homes built or in process at Sound Transit stations, 75% of which (2,670) are affordable units.
- Our first integrated joint development, an office building above U District Station, to be completed this fall
- \$2.1 billion in public-private TOD investments.
- 10,000 homes either in the development pipeline, under construction, or complete, just along the Lynnwood Link alignment.




Improving access to stations

- Installed secure, hourly bike lockers at all new stations, and partnered with King County and Bellevue to provide seamless access to Eastrail at Wilburton Station.
- Partnered with Community Transit, Pierce
 Transit, and King County Metro to design
 integrated bus networks for our three
 agencies that maximize access to light rail.
- Opened new parking lots/garages in Bellevue, Redmond, Shoreline (2), Mountlake Terrace, Puyallup and Lynnwood, with approximately 5,000 combined new parking stalls.



Making fare payment easy and equitable

- Implemented \$1 ORCA LIFT fares.
- Implemented \$3 flat fare on Link trains, eliminating tap-offs.
- Lowered regional day pass prices from \$8 to \$6.
- Introduced mobile ORCA payment for Android devices. Planning is in progress for adding additional payment options.



Improving passenger experience

- Launched real-time arrival information at all Link stations and updated digital signage.
- Renamed University Street Station to Symphony, eliminating passenger confusion.
- Replaced station pictograms with new station codes, following global best practices for secondary station identifiers.
- Investments in safety and security staff have almost doubled the number of staff in the field focusing on the well-being of our customers and employees.








Our investments are paying off

- Growth in new service and improvements to existing service are driving record-breaking ridership.
- The 1 Line regularly exceeds 100,000 daily boardings in summer and during special events, and more than 85,000 year-round.
- ~71,000 people rode the system on Lynnwood opening weekend.



Creating family-wage careers

- We're also providing benefits beyond a Great Ride: including creating high quality, family-wage careers across many skilled trades.
- Lynnwood Link Extension alone hired 8,500
 union construction workers who worked more
 than 6 million labor hours, including 1,500
 apprentices.
- 20% of Lynnwood apprentices were women, and 44% were apprentices of color.
- We're seeing similar results on our Federal Way Link Extension and the I-90 East Link completion.







Improving how we do business

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- Brought on national megaproject expertise.
- Signed the Equity in Infrastructure Project
 (EIP) pledge, recommitting to equitable
 procurement, apprenticeship and workforce
 development, and strong support of small and
 minority-owned businesses.
- Building the talent pipeline our growing region needs by partnering with schools and apprenticeship programs to help youth pursue careers in design, engineering, and construction.







Partnering to overcome challenges

- Worked with Metro and Community Transit to maximize 1 Line service frequency until the I-90 connection is complete and trains can access OMF East.
- Worked with industry contractors to overcome construction challenges, including:
 - Designed a new long-span bridge for the Federal Way project (Structure C).
 - Partnered to replace concrete plinths and other supporting elements of the I-90 portion of East Link.



Looking ahead

Light rail system growth: next 24 months

- 3 more Link extensions Downtown Redmond, East Link/I-90, and Federal Way.
- New 1 Line station in Seattle at NE 130th.
- Bringing service to new communities with 8
 new Link stations, growing 19% to 51 stations.
- Link will go 40% farther, with 18 new miles of track.
- Serving three new cities: Mercer Island, Kent, and Federal Way.
- Doubling service between Lynnwood and downtown Seattle.
